Although I am now their Treasurer, I was actually expelled from the College Republicans (CRs) for a short 3 month period during my second year at the U of C. My suspension from the CR's was subsequent to my opposition to the proposals of our President at the time. Our President's idea was to organize club members to try to gain a majority in the student government finance committee. Once appointed, we were to cut funding to liberal organizations on campus including the gay and lesbian society, the Womyn's Union and the College Democrats. Without student government funding the very existence of some of these organizations would be put in jeopardy. My friend and I went to the student papers with what we knew, and our President's efforts failed. In retaliation, he expelled both of us from the College Republicans. Fortunately, he was defeated in his bid for re-election later that year and I was readmitted to the club. Although my actions may have alienated some of the less open-minded College Republicans at the U. of C., I felt it was very important to stand up for the right of other political organizations on campus to organize, express their opinions and remain financially solvent.

**Medical Practice Act of 1985 (Act 112 of 1985)
